To find out what they are going to be doing they look at a picture schedule.




When they are finished doing one thing, they will know to move to the next using the schedule.

#### They use pictures to choose food to eat,








things to do,





### and also to tell us how they feel.




If they need help, they will use

### School work is made easier by having choices for answers.




# Students with autism may make noises, flap their arms or drop to the floor but it's just because they are excited.





You shouldn't be afraid because they might just be trying to say hello!


#### You can help them take turns and play with others.
